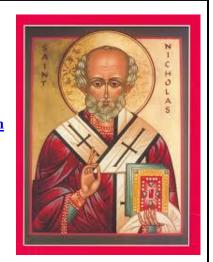

THE EPISTLE: St. Paul to the Hebrews. (1:10-2:3)

"In the beginning, Thou, O Lord, didst found the earth, and the heavens are the work of Thy hands; they will perish, but Thou remainest; they will all grow old like a garment, like a mantle Thou wilt roll them up, and they will be changed. But Thou art the same, and Thy years will never end." But to what angel has He ever said, "Sit at My right hand, until I make Thine enemies a stool for thy feet"? Are they not all ministering spirits sent forth to serve, for the sake of those who are to obtain salvation? Therefore, we must pay closer attention to what we have heard, lest we drift away from it. For if the message, declared by angels, was valid and every transgression or disobedience received a just retribution, how shall we escape if we neglect such a great salvation? It was declared at first by the Lord, and it was attested to us by those who heard Him.

THE GOSPEL: St. Mark. (2:1-12)

At that time, when Jesus returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that He was at home. And many were gathered together, so that there was no longer room for them, not even about the door; and He was preaching the Word to them. And they came, bringing to Jesus a paralytic carried by four men. And when they could not get near Jesus because of the crowd, they removed the roof above Him; and when they had made an opening, they let down the pallet on which the paralytic lay. And when Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven." Now, some of the scribes were sitting there, reasoning in their hearts, "Why does this man speak thus? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?" And immediately Jesus, perceiving in His spirit that they thus reasoned within themselves, said to them, "Why do you reason thus in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise, take up your pallet and walk'? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins" – He said to the paralytic – "I say to you, rise, take up your pallet and go home." And he rose, and immediately took up the pallet and went out before them all. So that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, "We never saw anything like this!"

الإنجيل: مرقس ٢: ١-١٢

في ذلك الزمان دخل يسوع كفرناحوم وسُمعَ أنّه في بيت. فللوقت اجتمع كثيرون حتّى إنّه ما عاد موضع و لا ما حول الباب يسع، وكان يخاطبهم بالكلمة. فأتوا إليه بمخلّع يحمله أربعة، وإذ لم يقدروا على أن يقتربوا إليه لسبب الجمع، كشفوا السقف حيث كان، وبعدما نقبوه دلّوا السرّير الذي كان المخلّع مضّجعًا عليه. فلمّا رأى يسوع إيمانهم، قال للمخلّع: يا بنيّ، مغفورة لك خطاياك. وكان قوم من الكتبة جالسين هناك يُفكّرون في قلوبهم: ما بال هذا يتكلّم هكذا بالتجديف؟ من يقدر على أن يغفر الخطايا إلّا الله وحده؟ فللوقت علم يسوع بروحه أنّهم يفكّرون هكذا في أنفسهم فقال لهم: لماذا تفكّرون بهذا في قلوبكم؟ ما الأيسر، أأن يُقال مغفورة لك خطاياك، أم أن يُقال قم واحمل سريرك وامش؟ ولكن لكي تعلموا أنّ ابن البشر له سلطان على الأرض أن يغفر الخطايا، قال للمخلّع: لك أقول قُم واحمل سريرك واذهب إلى بيتك. فقام للوقت وحمل سريره وخرج أمام الجميع حتّى دهشوا كلّهم ومجّدوا الله قائلين: ما رأبنا مثل هذا قطّ

Good Friday flowers: Dear Parishioners: To avoid misspelling the names, please do not call the church office. Mail or email the names along with the donation or put it in the tray on Sunday in an envelope with your name & write a memo that this donation is for the "Bier of Christ". Thank you for your cooperation.

One by one the weeks of Lent pass, and having started this journey with enthusiasm, feeling in ourselves the strength to complete it, when we approach the end, and often long before the end, we begin to feel that we have achieved nothing of what we hoped to achieve. We hoped to fast strictly and honestly, we hoped to pray, we hoped to tear ourselves away from those things that have enslaved all our lives - our interests, our concerns - and then a moment comes when the end of the journey is in sight, and suddenly we realise that nothing, or practically nothing, has been achieved of what we had hoped.

This is the moment when we may be attacked by the destructive spirit of despondency which undermines our last ounce of strength: how can I enter the days of the Passion? How can I encounter the glory and triumph of Christ's Resurrection? This is where we must evince both Christian wisdom and our trust in God. It is not by the fact that we strive and achieve some sort of result that we are saved; we are saved by our soul's longing which draws us towards the living God, by the love which draws us to Christ. And even when we fail (as, incidentally, in human relationships) we must not forget that just as the apostle Peter, after thrice denying Christ was able to answer Christ's threefold question, we can say "Lord, you know everything, you know my weakness, my lapses, my uncertainty, my inconstancy, but you also know that I love you, that that is the final deepest thing in me."

Then we can go farther, as Peter followed Christ, knowing that God believes in this love, that God believes us and believes in us. And we can go on with faltering steps, with uncertain tread, with ups and downs, if only our hearts do not break away from God; if only we carry on, so that one day, in a week or two, we may find ourselves face to face with the Lord's passion, with the manifestation of the love with which He loves us. To endure what He endured for our sakes can be done only through inexhaustible, bottomless love. And so if we cannot unite ourselves to Christ in a more mysterious way by communing to the way of the Cross through prayer, contemplation and ascetic effort, let us at least stand at the roadside, beside this way of the Cross and with the awe and tenderness of a shaken soul - or perhaps one incapable of awe and tenderness - look upon what it means to love as God is capable of loving us. And let us say to Him, if we cannot say anything else, "Thank you, Lord, that you love me, dead, stony, devoid of feeling, lifeless - love me so much that the day will come when for me also will sound the words spoken to Lazarus, then four days dead, "Lazarus, come forth from the grave."

One day each one of us will hear this, not at the end of time, not at the general resurrection, as Martha thought, but now, at some unexpected moment when the voice of God shall sound, and at once we shall come alive again, alive both in time and in eternity. And we can even approach Easter conscious that we have done nothing worthy of this meeting with the triumph of the Resurrection, have achieved nothing that would give us a right to this joy. As St. John Chrysostom says in his Easter sermon: "Those who have fasted and those who have not, those who have worked and those who have been lazy, all of you come, for the Lord receives everyone equally; to some He repays a debt, to others He makes a gift of His love." It is not likely that He will be repaying a debt to us, because we have not worked, but the gift of love is offered to each of us. Therefore whatever mood we are in, however lazy we are, however little we have striven, let us go step by step during these last weeks towards that light, as a butterfly is drawn to it: yet not to be burned by it - but rather for ourselves to burn with the glow of the Resurrection, to shine with its light, to become like the Burning Bush which burned and was not consumed in the flame of God's being.

تعاضد الجماعة: إيمان وإقدام وثبات

أربعة حملوا المفلوج وقدّموه للمسيح. لقد قدّموا أياديهم وطاقتهم وإرادتهم وتحسّسهم القلبيّ لواقع المفلوج. تحلّوا بعزيمة وإيمان ساعداهم على تجاوز العقبات المحتملة وتذليلها الواحدة تلو الأخرى: نفسيّة المريض، التعب الجسديّ، زحمة الناس، استحالة الدخول،.... لقد فسح لهم إقدامهم وجرأتهم بأن يكونوا مبتكرين في البحث عن حلول بديلة، واختيار أصعبها، عبر خطّة ثقب السقف وتدلية المفلوج منه.

هؤلاء الأربعة لم يألوا جهدًا فكريًا ولا جسديًا أو نفسيًا إلّا وتعاونوا على وضعه في تصرّف هذا المفلوج. كانت الجماعة حاضرة لمساعدة مَن كان بينهم محتاجًا، وتساعدوا بين بعضهم البعض ليكون لتعاضدهم النتيجة المرجوّة، لا بل غير المتوقّعة. تفرح بأن ترى فيهم نفوسًا مملوءة شهامة ونبلًا وعزمًا. لا يحسبون للتعب حسابًا! هذا كان خيار هم الأصعب، والذي بدا سهلًا عليهم، لا بل طبيعيًا بالنسبة إليهم. هذه هي طبيعة الإيمان المعيوش، لا أكثر و لا أقلّ.

ما هي الخيارات الذي كانت أمام المسيح؟ واحدة لا غير. إنها تلك التي يرويها الإنجيليّ: لقد أعطى كلّ ما لديه كما أعطى القادمون إليه كلّ ما لديهم. لا بل قدّم يسوع أفضل ما لديه، مقابل الأفضل الذي قدّمه الرجال الأربعة مع وداعة المفلوج الذي قبل خوض هذه المغامرة. فماذا قدّم المسيح؟ أوّلًا، غفران الخطايا، أي ترميم الإنسان من الداخل عبر دفق حياة جديدة، شافية ومحيية؛ عبر فتح البصر إلى مجال رؤية الله حقيقة وتسبيحه؛ عبر تقوية مفاصل النفس وإرادتها وقواها؛ عبر تنقية دوافعها ونيتاها. ثمّ، بعد ذلك، أتى شفاء الجسد تحصيلًا لما سبقه: «لك أقول قمْ واحمل سريرك واذهب إلى بيتك» (مرقس ٢: ١١). لقد قدّم يسوع شفاء كاملًا للمفلوج، وعبره وصلت رسالته إلى كلّ المحيطين به، بدءًا من بيته ومن المحيطين به حيث بُهِتَ الجميع ومجّدوا الله قائلين: «ما رأينا مثل هذا قطّ» (مرقس ٢: ١١).

لقد دفع يسوع بإقدام الرجال الأربعة وشهامتهم وتعاضدهم إلى حدّه الأقصى أي إلى كماله. لربّما هذا هو الشرط الأساس لكي تتدفّق فينا حياة الله، وأن تصير حياتنا طبيعيّة بحسب ما تكشفه لنا هذه الحادثة الإنجيليّة. فهل ننجح نحن بدورنا في حمل أثقال بعضنا البعض بحيث تكون محبّتنا منطلقًا ويصير تعاضدنا مفتاحًا لتغيير طبيعة هذه الأثقال من اعتلال إلى صحّة، من اضطراب إلى سلام، ومن انفعال إلى انضباط، ومن لامبالاة إلى اهتمام وعناية؟ أم سنكون بالمرصاد لكلّ محاولة إيجابيّة ولكلّ جهد بحيث ندخل عليه اعتبار اتنا الشخصيّة أو غير ها لنتساءل عن جدواها، أو أحقيّتها، أو مشروعيّتها، أو موافقتها لمعايير عندنا واعتبارات نحلّما؟

لا شكّ في أنّ طريقة التعاطي الصحيحة مع واقع المفلوج في كفرناحوم شكّلت مدماكًا أساسيًّا في بناء الجماعة المتحابّة والمتعاضدة والمتفاعلة. هذا باركه الربّ وفعّل النيّات الحاضرة والجهود القائمة في خطّ رسالته الكبرى: «يا بنيّ، مغفورة لك خطاياك» (مرقس ٢: ٥). هوذا واقعنا الراهن يتحدّانا بالطريقة عينها التي تحدّى بها واقع المفلوج الرجال الأربعة. فهل نقبل التحدّي ونأخذه على عاتقنا حتّى النهاية؟ وما النهاية سوى أن نسعى لنبلغ المسيح معًا بواقعنا ونطرحه أمامه بعرق جبيننا وهمّة سواعدنا، على مثال الرجال الأربعة. هلّا تجذبنا نعمة المسيح فنجتمع حوله «حتّى ما عاد يسع و لا ما حول الباب» (مرقس ٢: ٢)؟ هلّا نجتهد في الصلاة والصوم والخدمة فننقب السطح عندما لا نقدر على أن «نقترب إليه من أجل الجمع» (مرقس ٢: ٤)، بحيث نطرح أمامه جهودنا في تبنّي واقعنا فيعطينا أن تصير كما يشاؤها، جميلة، صحيحة، بالغة، مباركة؟

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
