



Nativity Fast (Advent) is the period preceding the Christmas season in which we abstain from meat and dairy products. Eating fish is allowed except Wednesdays and Fridays, and we can eat all the regular meals like breakfasts, lunches, and dinners. The purpose of this fast is seeking the spirituality and the preparation for the feast of the advent of our Lord on December 25th.

THE EPISTLE: Ephesians. (5:8-19)

Brethren, walk as children of light—for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness and righteousness

and truth—proving what is acceptable to the Lord; and have no communion with the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them; for it is a shame even to speak of the things which they do in secret. But all things when they are exposed are made manifest by the light, for everything that is made manifest is light. Therefore, he says: "Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will shine upon thee." See then that you walk circumspectly, not as unwise, but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Therefore, do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit; speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and chanting in your heart to the Lord.

الرسالة: أفسس 5:8-19

THE GOSPEL: Luke. (14:16-24)

The Lord spoke this parable: "A man once gave a great banquet, and invited many; and at the time for the banquet he sent his servant to say to those who had been invited, 'Come; for all is now ready.' But, one by one, they all began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have bought a field, and I must go out and see it; I pray you, have me excused.' And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to examine them; I pray you, have me excused.' And another said, 'I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.' So the servant came and reported this to his master. Then the householder in anger said to his servant, 'Go out quickly to the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in the poor and maimed and blind and lame.' And the servant said, 'Sir, what you commanded has been done, and still there is room.' And the master said to the servant, 'Go out to the highways and hedges, and compel people to come in, that my house may be filled. For I tell you, none of those men who were invited shall taste my banquet.' For many are called, but few are chosen."

الإنجيل: لوقا 16:14-24

Metropolitan Anthony of Sourozh Bridal Feast

How often have we heard today's a parable about those people who were called to the Bridal Feast of the King, and who refused to come. The one who had acquired a plot of land; he thought he was in possession of it; in reality, he was so attached to it that he could not detach himself from it: he was a prisoner of what he thought he possessed. And so it is with whatever we imagine we possess; it is enough for us to have the smallest thing in our hand — and this hand is alienated to us; we cannot use it anymore, we cannot use our arm, our whole body is conditioned by what we possess, or imagine we possess: we are held a prisoner by it.

Others refused to come because they had bought five pairs of oxen: they had to try them, they had a task to fulfil, they had work to do, they had perhaps what they believed to be a mission in life, and therefore they had no time for anything except that that was their personal concern.

And the last refused to come because his heart was full of his own joy; having married, how could he be concerned with anyone else's marriage? He was full of his own joy — how could he participate in anyone else's joy? And so, they all turned away from the call.

Doesn't it apply very directly to us? Each of us possesses something that he deems so important that he is prepared to turn away from God — yes, from God: there is no time for prayer, there is no time for worship. At the same time we turn away from other people who need us because we are busy with our own business?

And how often happens that we are full of joy or of sorrow — but they are our own, we hug them to our heart, we have no time for anyone else's sorrow or anyone else's joy.

But then, what should we do? You hear every Sunday in the Liturgy words that say, 'Let us lay aside all the cares of this life'; does it mean that we must turn away from the earth on which we live, from the tasks which are ours, from the joys and true sorrows that come our way? No! But there is an answer to it perhaps in the lines that precede the reading from the Epistle which we heard today, where we are told: Are you risen with Christ? Are you where He is? Is your life hid in God with Christ? What does it really mean to us? It means that if we are dead with the death of Christ to everything which is destructive of love, destructive of compassion, which is selfcentredness, which is self-love, which leaves no space for anyone but ourselves — if we are dead to all this, and if we have accepted life on Christ's terms, ready to live for others, live for God, live for the joy and life of those who surround us — then we are risen with Christ, and our life is indeed hid with Christ in God, it is at the very depth of God, at the very depth of divine love! And then we can turn to the earth; then, instead of possessing we can serve, instead of overpowering we can try to bring this earth of ours, in an act of love, in an act of reverence to be free, to be God's earth, to be able to bring fruit, not as it does being raped, being violently possessed by us, but giving us its fruit in an act of responsive love. And the same applies to our tasks; we are called to serve, we are called to make of all our life an act of concern, of love, of service — then, all that we do becomes an act of God, then it becomes meaningful and it does not separate us from God.

And if joy has come into our heart, it is a gift of God; if sorrow has come into our heart, we can carry it to God, for it to be integrated in the mystery of salvation!

Let us reflect on this! Let us truly lay aside all the cares of this life in the sense that let us not be prisoners, but free: Christ has come to set us free. And then the earth, and our labour, and our joys, and our sorrows and everyone on earth will become part of the Kingdom of God. Then indeed, our life will be hid with Christ in God, but a God Who have chosen so to love the world as to be incarnate, to become man among men, to take upon Himself all the human destiny, createdness,

life in a fallen world, the consequences of human sin, and even the loss of God which is what kills. And, having accepted it all in an act of saving and redempting love, He has risen, and anyone can enter into eternal life, the life of the resurrection by uniting himself or herself to Christ.

أحد الأجداد - المطران جاورجيوس

الأحد الذي يلي هذا، أحد النسبة، نذكر فيه الآباء بدءًا بإبراهيم، ومنهم جاء المسيح في الجسد حسب رواية متى. وهذه اللائحة هي لائحة الآباء العبرانيين مع أن إبراهيم لم يكن عبرانيًا. متّى وجّه إنجيله الى اليهود الذين كانوا ينتظرون أن المسيح يجيء منهم. غير أن السيد يجيء أيضًا ممن عاشوا قبل اليهود. وهذا ما سيذكره لوقا إذ يجعل الرب يسوع ليس فقط من إبراهيم ولكن من آدم. ربما كان لوقا وثنيّ الأصل من أنطاكية او كان من الدخلاء على اليهودية وأراد أن يعطى الطابع الانساني الشامل لشخص المسيح.

هذه الرؤية الشاملة جسدتها الكنيسة في هذا الأحد الذي نذكر فيه أجدادًا للمسيح هم من الأُمم (أي من الوثنيين). نرتل في صلاة الغروب: "لقد زكيت بالإيمان الآباء القدماء، وبهم سبقت فخطبت البيعة التي من الأُمم". وأيضًا أن المسيح المنقذ "عظم الأجداد في جميع الأمم". منهم من كان وثنيا بوضوح، ومنهم من كان يهوديا. يذكر ملكيصادق الذي أتى ذكره في الرسالة الى العبر انبين.

هذا استقبل إبراهيم من كسرة الملاك وأعطاه إبراهيم عشرا من كل شيء. "لا بداءة أيام له ولا نهاية حياة بل هو مشبّه بابن الله". وليس عبرانيا. ونذكر الأجداد ابتداء من آدم.

لذلك كان المسيح أوسع من إسرائيل ورئيسَ إسرائيلِ اللهِ الذي هو الكنيسة. لذلك يقول بولس في الرسالة الى اهل غلاطية: "ليس يوناني ولا يهوديّ"، والمراد بها أن الآتين من الحضارة اليونانية صاروا واحدا في الكنيسة مع الآتين من إسرائيل، ويرادفها قوله "لا ختان (يعني اليهود) ولا قلف" وهكذا يُسمّي الوثنيين الذين لا يختتنون. كذلك يقول "لا بربريّ ولا اسكيثيّ". البربريّ حسبما قال أرسطو هو غير اليوناني. الاسكيثيون من أصل إيرانيّ كانوا ساكنين في جنوبي روسيا.

كل هذه الاختلافات العنصرية التي كان الأقدمون يعتدون بها لا تتوحد الا اذا انضمت الى المسيح، ومن هذه الزاوية تكون تخلّصت من عداوة الأعراق، وكل ما كان عندها في وثنيّتها من خير وعلم ومعرفة يكون مهيئًا لمجيء المخلّص. المسيح قبل ميلاده من مريم كان بطريقة او اخرى تُمتمُهُ كل الشعوب القديمة وتنتظره بما عندها من صلاح وفهم. فإن المسيح، لو كان من اليهود في جسده، انما كان من الناحية المعنوية وريث كل الحضارات. عمّدها بالإنجيل، وسقط من فكرها ما كان ضد الإنجيل، وثبت ما كان من الإنجيل.

كلمات للمسيح قبل تدوين الأناجيل كانت مزروعة في ثقافات الشعوب التي تقدّمت يسوع واعتنقته وورث منها المخلّص ما ورث، وطرحت هي بمجيئها اليه ما كان يتنافى مع رسالته، وصار هو للجميع كل شيء.

ما ورت، وطرحت هي بمجيبه اليه ما كان يت في مع رسالته، وصدر هو للجميع كن سيء. عندما نأتي الى المسيح من أيّ موروث ثقافيّ، يبقى هو سيّدًا على كل ما نعرف ونحسّ، ويظلّ وحده قطب شخصيّتنا ومنتهى طريقنا الى الآب.
