

THE EPISTLE: Ephesians. (5:8-19)

Brethren, walk as children of light—for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true—and try to learn what is pleasing to the Lord. Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. For it is a shame even to speak of the things that they do in secret; but when anything is exposed by the light it becomes visible, for anything that becomes visible is light. Therefore, it is said, "Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give you light." Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise, making the most of the time, because the days are evil. Therefore, do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. الإنجيل: لوقا

Metropolitan Anthony of Sourozh **EUCHARIST**

Every time we approach the holy chalice to receive Communion to the Body and Blood of Christ we say a prayer that contains words that must become true on our lips, otherwise they are a lie before God. We say to God that we are the worst sinner, we are the chief sinner that there is.

And isn't it natural that so often we say these words thinking, 'This was true of the saints, who could feel that way, but I can't feel that I am the worst of sinners'. When we look around, when we look at the state of the world in which we live, we can see a number of people who in our eyes are worse than we are. And regarding this I would like to remind you of a passage in the diary of Saint John of Kronstadt, who also asked himself the same question, and in the end answered it in the affirmative: 'Yes, I am the worst of all the sinners I know'.

And the reason he gave for this judgement of his was that he was aware of how much God had given him, and how little he had given to God in response.

I think we must all of us begin in this frame of mind, ask ourselves: What are the gifts which God has bestowed upon us? What is it that makes us so happy in ourselves, or makes others so happy in us, rightly or wrongly? And when we have come to understand how much we have received, then we can ask ourselves: what are the fruits which we have borne of these gifts?

And we will see that, according to the first Beatitude, there is nothing in us, in our life, which is our own, of our own making. God gave us life. He gave us a body, a soul, a mind. He gave us all that fills our lives with richness. All that we are and all that we possess are gifts of his. Do we give Him gratitude for it, or do we appropriate these gifts, thinking no, they are our own really? And even when we are aware of the fact that they are not of our making, that it is God who has given us all that we are and all that we have, do we know how to be grateful and also to ask ourselves the question which I have already mentioned: what have I done with all the gifts of God? And if we go ever more deeply within ourselves and in our lives, can we begin to be able to say: yes, I really am the worst of all the sinners around me because I am so richly endowed by God and look how little, how very little, I have brought to God and to my neighbour as a result of it?

Let us all reflect on this. And when we come next time to Communion and we think or say these words, let us say them with at least a beginning of understanding that yes, it is true, and I know why. But come with an incipient understanding, because it takes a very long time for us to see how richly God has endowed us and how poorly we have responded to Him. But gradually, step by step, these words will become true and we will receive Communion with a new depth of broken-heartedness and with gratitude.

لدافع إلى الانطلاق من جديد

أن تنطلق من جديد هو حدث يوميّ يحتاج منك إلى قوّة الالتزام والمثابرة من دون فقدان الرجاء. فما هو الدافع الذي يساعدك كلّ يوم لتقدّم هذا الجهد برجاء وبساطة؟ شهادة أعمى أريحا تعطيك الجواب. بالفعل، كان هذا الأعمى محتاجًا إلى الاستعطاء ليقي نفسه العوز، محتاجًا إلى النور لكي يرى، إلى مَن يرأف به لأنّه متروك لمصيره، إلى المعنى لكي يستمرّ. هذا، وإن بدت حاله مزرية إلى هذا الحدّ، لم يترك نفسه يومًا تغرق في اليأس. خبرة أمثاله تعلّمنا كيف ينهضون من جديد كلّ يوم ويجدون في أنفسهم القوّة والدافع الكافيين ليتعهّدوا بهما أنفسهم، فلا يستسلمون، بل يشعّون لمن حولهم بشهادة مميّزة. أخذ أعمى أريحا موقعه «جالسًا على الطريق يستعطي» (لوقا ١٨: ٥٦)، وظهر شديد الحساسيّة لما يجري حوله، على عكس المحيطين به. فلمّا سمع جلبة، استفسر «ما عسى أن يكون هذا؟»، فاستوقفه مرور يسوع من هناك، لذا عمد إلى أن يستوقفه بدوره صارخًا: «ريا يسوع ابن داود ارحمني» (لوقا ١٨: ٣٦ و ٣٨). لم يصرخ لأنّ المسيح لا يأبه له، بل ليتغلّب على محيطه غير المبالي به والمتضجّر منه والعديم الشفقة، إذ «انتهره المتقدّمون ليسكت!» (لوقا ١٨: ٣٦). ثابر حتّى أفلح على محيطه غير المبالي وموقف المحيطين به!

أنّ تجاهر بالمسيح وبحاجتك إليه هو لا غيره، أمر مفروغ منه عندما تتأمّل في الأحداث بعد إسدال الستارة عليها، لكنّ الأمر ليس كذلك قبل ذلك. ففي خضم المخاض، أنت تشعر أحيانًا أنّك تجاهد على غير هوى، فلا ترى بازغة نور، ويخبو رجاؤك برؤيته يومًا. فهل تصغي إلى الذين يرون الواقع بتذمّر وشكوى وسوداويّة، وليس عندهم رجاء؟ أتخالفهم وتختلف معهم، أم تماشيهم وتتموضع على غرارهم؟ بالفعل، أن تعرف ما تريد، وأن تريده من كلّ قلبك، يبدو بسيطًا في بدء الأمر؛ ولكن أن تثابر عليه فلا تضيّع الهدف ولا تتوانى في الوصول إليه، فهذا، لعمري، أمر ليس متوافرًا لدى كثيرين اليوم. أعمى أريحا مثال يُحتذى.

فلننتقلُ إلى المقلب الثاني من الواقعة، حيث يبرز حوار من نوع آخر، جديد وبسيط بالكلّية، حوار جمع الأعمى ويسوع. به يداوي المسيح الجمع المتدافع حوله والمعميّ عن رؤية الأشياء والأحداث والأشخاص على حقيقتها، أي بنور المسيح، ويكافئ مثابرة الأعمى المتروك لمصيره. «فوقف (يسوع) وأمر بأن يقدَّم إليه» (لوقا ١٨: ٤٠). هكذا يستوقف يسوعُ هذا الجمع ويدفعه، من حيث لا يدري، إلى تحسّس واقع الأعمى والمشاركة في مجرى الأحداث اللاحقة، ولو أنّ، عمليًا، كان الأعمى يحتاج إلى من يقوده بيده حتّى المسيح. سياق الأحداث أظهر أنّه هو من قاد الأخرين إلى المسيح، وعلّمهم كيف يدنون من هذا الأخير وكيف يتعلّمون أن يروا بمنظاره! كان الحوار مقتضبًا: «ماذا تريد أن أفعل بك؟... أن أبصر... أبصر، أبصر، إيمانك قد شفاك» (لوقا ١٨: ٢١٤). على ضوء هذه الاستعدادات والشكيمة، لقاء المؤمن بالمسيح انفتحت معه أبواب النعمة فعينا الأعمى، ولربّما أبواب الخلاص لمن أراد من المحيطين به حينها، ومنّا نحن اليوم! ألعلّ الضوضاء حولنا تفعل فعلها فينا اليوم كما كانت الجموع المحيطة بالأعمى حينها، فتمنعنا من طلب المسيح بإلحاح؟ أم التصاقنا بيسوع صوريّ وسطحيّ بحيث لا نستوقفه البتّة ليرانا ويحاورنا ويشفينا؟ أم فقداننا المثابرة وغياب اليقين بالمخلص حجبا عنّا أنّنا عميان عن إدارك حقيقة الأشياء، فنتدافع على غير هدى في أوقات نحن بأمسّ الحاجة فيها إلى أقصى درجات الرؤية والتمييز والإدر اك؟

انتهت القصة بشفاء الأعمى وتمجيده الله وتسبيح الجمع أيضًا. فهل أسدات بذلك الستارة حقًا؟ يبدو لنا أنّ ثغرة بقيت مفتوحة لنطل عبرها على فعل صغير سيكون له مفعول كبير: «أبصر وتبعه» (لوقا ١٨: ٤٣). تلازُم هذين الفعلين يضعنا على محكّ أن نرى ما رآه هذا الأعمى، وأن نلتزم بما قام به، فننطلق مثله وليس على منوال الجمع المرافق للمسيح! أليست في هذا تكمن كلّ قصة النهوض من جديد؟ أليس هذا هو سرّ الدافع الذي نود لو يحرّكنا، وبه، وبفضل ثباتنا ومثابرتنا، نعين أترابنا في محنهم حتّى يروا هذا الدافع فيهم فيقوموا من العمى الذي يأسر قراءتهم للواقع، أيًا كان هذا الواقع معقدًا، وينطلقوا بدورهم، فتكرّ السبحة، وهكذا دواليك، حتّى لا يبقى أحد خارجًا من رؤية خدر المسيح؟



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


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
